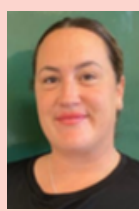

The Curriculum

This half term, we will be writing first person narratives containing flashbacks based on the book 'Wild Boy' by Rob Lloyd Jones and will be writing our own newspaper reports in English. Our class text is A Monster Calls by Patrick Ness. We will be delving deeper into our learning on fractions in maths and will be comparing them with decimals and percentages and in science, we will be learning about animals and their habitats. In history, we will be studying the Industrial Revolution and will be exploring how this time in history has impacted our lives today.

The children will be learning the skills involved in gymnastics and dance in PE and units will include 'Bhangra' and '70s Disco'. In computing, we will be learning how to blog whilst, in music, we will be exploring jazz.

Our art unit is drawing self portraits and in French, children will be learning how to introduce and talk about their pets. In PSHE, they will be learning how to celebrate differences and will explore bullying. Finally, in R.E. we will be exploring the question, 'Do you need to be good to believe in God' and will be comparing Christian and Buddhist beliefs.
